FAZtor's Notes

This weekend is our Parish Lenten Recollection at St. Mary's Cathedral. We are joining other parishioners from the different parishes of our Archdiocese. Father Robert Christian, OP will be leading us in the reflection on "Grace and the Lenten Season." Fr. Christian is the Master of Students of the Western Dominical Province and adjunct professor at the Dominican School of Philosophy and Theology in Berkeley.

The Sulpician Fathers will be saying goodbye after 118 years of service at our local seminary of St. Patrick's in Menlo Park. Archbishop Cordileone has appointed Rev. George E. Schultze, S.J. to the post of President-Rector and Vice Chancellor of St. Patrick's Seminary and University effective July 1st. Fr. Schultze is a Mountain View native. He entered the California Province of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in 1984.

We will also have a new Superintendent of Schools for the Archdiocese of San Francisco. Archbishop Cordileone has appointed Pamela Lyons to succeed Dr. Nina Russo, who has served as interim superintendent for the past two years and is retiring after 7 years in archdiocesan leadership and a 36 year career in education.

Riordan High School will also have a new President starting July 1st. The Archbishop has appointed Andrew T. Currier. Mr. Currier is a seasoned principal in Catholic elementary schools in South Bend, Indiana and Beltsville, Maryland.

More school news, which everybody probably knew already, St. Charles Borromeo School in San Francisco, will be suspending operations at the end of the current school year in June. Enrollment has declined by almost half over the past three years and the 130-year old building faces imminent serious construction and seismic retrofitting.

We are blessed and fortunate our Holy Name School student numbers are still strong. In fact, we already have a waiting list of applicants for our Kindergarten and Preschool for the coming year. As any other private school in San Francisco, we will also undergo seismic retrofitting and we may be able to start a small portion of the work this summer. Many thanks to our principal Natalie Cirigliano, preschool director Alice Seher and all the teachers for all their efforts to keep HN School so successful throughout these years.

The teacher of the earth science class was lecturing on map reading.

After explaining about latitude, longitude, degrees and minutes the teacher asked, "Suppose I asked you to meet me for lunch at 23 degrees, 4 minutes north latitude and 45 degrees, 15 minutes east longitude...?"

NEXT SUNDAY'S SECOND COLLECTION CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES

The Catholic Relief Services Collection supports Catholic Church organizations that carry out international relief and solidarity efforts. Programs include relief and resettlement for victims of persecution, war, and natural disasters; development projects to improve living conditions for the poor; legal and support services for poor immigrants; peace and reconciliation work for people suffering from violence; and advocacy on behalf of the powerless.

In the developing world, it is often hard for families to support themselves and their children. Sophie, a widow working in a village in Burkina Faso, was struggling to feed her family and pay for schooling for her children. Thanks to the help of Catholic Relief Services, one of the CRSC-supported organizations, her village was able to set up a Savings and Internal Lending Community (SILC). Through the SILC, members contribute what they can afford, allowing them to pool their resources and save collectively. Members can then borrow money to meet pressing needs or develop business opportunities. Through the SILC, Sophie was able to take out a \$200 loan to cover startup costs for her own canteen, a sum that would be nearly impossible for her to save. Her canteen has been very successful and began to pay off in only six months. Her community has benefited too, as she has been able to hire three assistants to work with her. Without the SILC and the work of CRS, it would have been nearly impossible for her, and others like her, to create a sustainable life for her and her family.

Helping Jesus in Disguise

In keeping with the theme "Help Jesus in Disguise," the funds collected through the CRS Collection support vital Catholic programs that share in the Catholic mission of promoting the sacredness of human life and the dignity of the human person.
