FAZtor's Notes

Congratulations to all those who are receiving their First Communion on this Saturday morning. A baby's first smile, a baby's first word, or a baby's first step is so special to parents. But First Confession and First Communion are so special to both the parents and the child. It is truly an honor and privilege on my part to give these sacraments for the first time to these children. The whole church rejoices to such occasions.

The church was celebrating First Communion. The priest gives a homily about Communion and what it is all about. He explained: "The Bible talks of Holy Communion being a 'joyful feast'. What does that mean? Well, 'joyful' means happy, right? And a feast is a meal. So a 'joyful feast' is a happy meal. And what are the three things we need for a happy meal?" A little boy put up his hand and said, "Hamburger, fries, and a regular soft drink?"

First Communion is not just a happy meal but the happiest meal. Imagine you are partaking of the precious body and blood of Christ as food for your spiritual nourishment. If you want a happy life, you should take communion as often as you can.

A man came to a priest and wanted to make fun of his faith, so he asked: "How can bread and wine turn into the Body and Blood of Christ?"

The priest answered, "No problem. You yourself change food into your body and blood, so why can't Christ do the same."

But the objector did not give up. He asked, "But how can the entire Christ be in such a small host?"

"In the same way that the vast landscape before you can fit into your little eye."

But he still persisted, "How can the same Christ be present in all your churches at the same time?"

The priest then took a mirror and let the man look into it. Then he let the mirror fall to the ground and break and said to the skeptic, "There is only one of you and yet you can find your face redirected in each peace of that broken mirror at the same time." (*Willi Hoffsuemmer*)

We are the Body of Christ broken to one another for the life of the world. Be a part of that body as we commence with the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal 2017 this weekend. I am even happier to tell you that some of you have already given to this year's appeal, even before we have officially launched it. This shows how generous, responsive and supportive our parishioners are.

I don't recall asking for money, other than for this appeal, during the last year. So, I am putting out my "disclaimer" for those first timers and non-regular attendees at Holy Name.

Goodbye to February! The Season of Lent starts this week with Ash Wednesday, the first day of the month of March. Let us march for 40 days to the cross of Jesus. Let us march to its glory and to where our salvation awaits us.
