November is a month to honor the deceased. It has now become a tradition in our parish to celebrate a Memorial Mass for our deceased parishioners who have died within the past twelve months. This mass is scheduled for this week-

end, Saturday, November 16<sup>th</sup> at 11am. There are 27 parishioners on the list. For next year we will be adding longtime and devoted parishioner Lorraine Macias, who just passed away a week ago. More than being a devoted parishioner who was actively involved in the life of the parish, she was devoted to God faithfully praying and going to mass despite her being physically challenged. She defied the odds overcoming obstacles by riding on an electric powered wheel chair just to attend the Sunday 11:30 AM mass regularly and whenever the weekday mass was celebrated in the church, like the weekly school masses. Even with her limited mobility she enjoyed playing bingo with the Senior Club every Thursday and even going on casino trips. She is an inspiration to all of us for her unstoppable love of God. Her Memorial Mass will be this Tuesday, November 19<sup>th</sup> at 11 AM here in our church.

A few days ago, I was looking at my college diploma that has been hanging on the wall. After looking closely at the dates, I realized that this month marks the 25<sup>th</sup> year since I obtained my Bachelor's degree in Music. In a way, this month is my Silver Jubilee after graduating from the Conservatory of Music.

What greater way to celebrate this musical milestone than the Father Arnold's Children's Concert that I will be leading this Friday, November 22<sup>nd</sup> and Saturday, November 23<sup>rd</sup> at 7 PM. Some twenty-five years ago my life revolved around doing concerts. I traveled around the world for concert tours with the Philippine's premiere and world-renowned choir, *The Philippine Madrigal Singers*. I traveled to the different cities in the US as the choirmaster of *Chorus Paulinus* and as music director of the *Singing Priests of Tagbilaran*, both groups I founded. Haven't even thought about it, but I have given up fame and prestige to follow the path that was meant to be.

I don't remember now that last time I directed and produced a concert. So next weekend's "Father Arnold's Children's Concert" will be special to me. We have seven talented kids in the parish who have been serving as cantors and altar servers: **Natalie Arriola**, 7 yrs old, **Sophia Howard**, 9; **Benjamin Sabater**, 9; **Ysabella Sarignaya**, 10; **Angela Canlas**, 11; **Jaylyn Remolona**, 12 and **Jayden Sabater**, 12. When I say "concert," it is a production with staging, costumes and choreography. The kids will not just be standing and singing. They will be performing, dancing and acting.

Grammy Nominee Frances England, a HN school parent, will also be singing her original songs and performing with the kids. *The Praise and Glory* choir that I have been coaching from St. Augustine's parish will perform an intermission number on the first night and our Holy Name 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Graders will do the intermission at the next evening's performance. They are all my children. That's why the concert is entitled "Father's Children." But ultimately, we are all "The Father's Children." So, don't miss the show!

## YOUR HEALTH MATTERS! Addiction

You have heard about the growing concern over people becoming addicted to pain medications, but did you know that people can become addicted to certain foods? The top 8 foods items that people are addicted to be:

Pizza	4.01	Ice Cream	3.68
Chocolate	3.73	French Fries	3.36
Chips	3.73	Cheeseburgers	3.51

What causes food addiction? Consuming foods that are high in carbohydrates, fat, salt, sugar, or artificial sweeteners, triggers the pleasure center of the brain and releases "feel good" chemicals such as dopamine and serotonin. These foods affect the same area of the brain as drugs, alcohol, and behaviors such as shopping or gambling! Highly palatable foods often contain unnatural substances or higher – than-normal levels of natural substances that your body and brain can't process. This results in your body being flooded with "feel good" chemicals. There is research showing that people that are addicted to sugar has the same "feel good" effect as the person who is addicted to opiates! There is also research that says eating cheese has "morphine-like compounds" called casomorphins that attach to the brain's opiate receptors, making the food even harder to resist than its high levels of fat and salt already do on their own.

Food addiction is difficult to prevent because it's impossible to avoid food. However, one of the best strategies is to avoid over exposure to palatable foods by eating a healthy, balanced diet that is rich in natural, unprocessed foods, preplanning your meals, and eating more mindfully.
