The Archdiocese celebrates the Annual Chinese New Year this Saturday with a mass at 2:30 PM at St. Mary's Cathedral and a Dinner Gala at 5:30 PM. Our parish will have our own celebration of Chinese New Year next Sunday at the 11:30 AM mass followed by a reception in the Flanagan Center.

Meanwhile, join me in thanking God for the gift of life as I celebrate my birthday this Sunday. Celebrating my 50th year eight times in a row, a friend of mine sent me advice for those 50 years and older. This may not be for you, but may still apply to you.

Hear this:

Because none of us have many years to live, and we can't take anything with us when we go, we don't have to be too thrifty.

Spend the money that should be spent, enjoy what should be enjoyed, donate what you are able to donate.

DON'T WORRY about what will happen after we are gone, because when we return to dust, we won't feel any praises or criticisms. The time to enjoy this worldly life and your hard earned wealth will be over!

DON'T WORRY too much about your children, for they will have their own destiny and should find their own way. Care for them, love them, give them gifts but also enjoy your money or what is left of it, while you can. Life should have more to it than working from the cradle to the grave!!

50-year olds, don't trade in your health for wealth by working yourself to an early grave anymore. Because your money may not be able to buy your health.

When should one stop making money, and how much is enough? (A hundred thousand, one million, ten million, one billion?)
