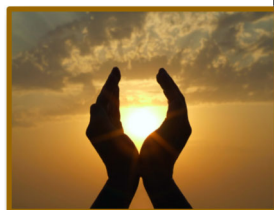

Stewards Corner

Is Your Light Shining?

One of God's greatest blessings is sunlight.

Light is so basic, so necessary, and so wonderful. It is essential for life. Because of the light from the sun, we can see the beauty of God's creation. We have light because God said, "Let there be light, and there was light" (Genesis 1:3). Until God made light, the world was dark. What the Creator God did for the earth, the Redeemer God does for us humans. John, the apostle, tells us how this has come about. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us..." (John 1:1, 14). In Jesus, John told us, "The true light which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world" (John 1:9). Jesus is that true light, and he told us, "You are the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14). It is his light within us being reflected that allows us to carry out his command: "your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." (Matthew 5:16). We are called to keep the light that God gives us burning brightly and shining for the entire world to see. "Nor do they light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket; it is set on a lampstand, where it gives light to all in the house." (Matthew 5:15). Nourished through Word and the Holy Eucharist, we can be faithful reflections of God's light.



There is a wonderful old hymn called "In the Garden." Perhaps you will remember the first verse and the refrain:

*I come to the garden alone while
the dew is still on the roses, and
the voice I hear falling on my ear,
the Son of God discloses.*

Refrain: *And he walks with me, and he talks with me, and
he tells me I am his own; and the joy we share as we tarry
there, none other has ever known. (C. A. Miles 1913)*

We are reminded of Christ's last words: "I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Mt. 28:20) Christ is indeed our eternal companion. His promise is indeed to walk and talk with us throughout all of our lives; a promise on which we can always rely. When we sincerely decide to be open to Christ's companionship and to live so as to make him proud of us, we will want to show it in our daily living ... including our stewardship.

St. Paul told the Christians in Ephesus that Christians are "created in Christ Jesus for good works." (Eph. 2:10) "Good works" has to do with stewardship. That is, using our minds, our strength, our talents, our resources to serve our Lord and Savior daily. That is a big order, so remember we have our eternal Companion who stands ready to help us in our "good works" for the Kingdom of God. Surely we would not want to fail our Lord in that endeavor.

Prayer: Stir us up, O Lord, that we may always be ready to do "good works," including acts of stewardship for the sake of the Kingdom of God.

MAY 5, 2019: THE THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

The Shawshank Redemption was the hit film of 1994. In it we follow the incarceration and escape plans of Tim Robbins and Morgan Freeman. Robbins is condemned to life imprisonment for the murder of his wife and her lover. Freeman says he is the "only guilty man in Shawshank Prison." Based on Stephen King's novella, this uplifting film is a surprise package from a writer whose fame comes from the horror genre.

The longer we watch the film, the more we realize that Stephen King has modelled his story on the Gospel of John. It is, in many respects a more modern parable about John's portrait of Jesus. Tim Robbins' character, Andy, like Jesus, is an innocent man, treated harshly by the authorities of his day. He has to endure the condemnation and cruelty of the leading religious zealots who are keepers of law and order, while he inspires others to think of a world free of subjection and oppression where they can be free to live the life of which they dream. Like John's Jesus, Andy has big dreams and often talks in riddles, but he leaves clues for others to follow him in their quest for freedom.

In the last part of the film, after Andy has successfully escaped and the governor of the prison has been exposed for the hypocrite he is, Freeman is paroled after serving 35 years hard labor. He decides to go where Andy has gone and, just as Andy promised when they were together in prison, he finds that Andy has prepared the way for him to follow. The moving climax of the film comes as Robbins and Freeman meet on a beach, embrace each other and share food and drink to celebrate the new life both of them have discovered.

Stephen King understands John's portrait of Jesus very well. For all of Jesus' assuredness and composure throughout the Gospel, the sense of care and intimacy in the encounters with his friends is deeply moving.

In the Easter Gospel to which we have just listened, Jesus returns to where his friends have fled from Jerusalem. In a parable about the growing numbers of the early Church, the Eucharist and the suffering they are enduring, John reaffirms that Jesus is intimately present in their following of him and their suffering for the Kingdom. The only sense John can make of Jesus' death, the martyrdom of the apostles or the persecution of the early church is to see them all as acts of love. "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends."

Those of us who have been caught up in the net of God's love are heirs to the same promises of Jesus' fidelity. Christ is intimately present to us in every act of loving sacrifice we undertake for him. He continues to send us out to tell people of the place that has been prepared for them at the banquet of life and he gives us strength to gird our loins for the times when life takes us to places we would rather not go.

In this Eucharist let's be grateful for this Easter season when we celebrate again that we have been set free from the prison of our fears and shown the way to live a life of sacrificial love and undeserved redemption.

Our Lady of Sheshan

又是一年春暖花开的五月：一个可以修整种植花木、郊游踏青，或者休闲度假的好时节；同时，为我们教友来说，五月更是属于圣母的季节。

這個聖母月的由來，不但與古希臘和古羅馬神話故事中，將五月與寓意美麗多產的月亮女神和興旺繁盛的花神有關；而且隨著時代的變遷和社會的發展，大約從中世紀（五 - 十五世紀）開始，一個傳統的三十天敬禮聖母的熱心行動：聖母月（八月十五 - 九月十四）已經開始形成，不過還只是在個別地區舉行；直到巴洛克時期（十七 - 十八世紀中葉），才慢慢地有了將一個完整的月份奉獻給聖母的想法，並最終得以將三十天的特別敬禮與五月份完全結合

在了一起；而最後，到了十九世紀，五月聖母月的敬禮已經遍及世界各地。

那麼我們又該如何善用這個聖月呢？當然正如我們每一個人在天主眼中都是獨一無二的，因此，敬禮聖母的方式也完全可以因人而異。不過，一些傳統的敬禮聖母的方式，無疑是值得推薦的：恭念玫瑰經、布置聖母祭臺等；而另一個特別隆重和合適的活動，則是向聖母敬獻花冠（或花環）；無疑地，所有的這些方式也完全可以在你自己的家中舉行，比如供奉聖母態像、向聖母獻花等。無論你採用哪一種方式，總是記得問一問自己：這個敬禮或靈修的操練，是否真能幫助你效法聖母的德表，更加愛主愛人？

特別值得一提的是：每年的五月二十四日「佘山聖母進教之佑瞻禮」，是教宗本篤十六世於二零零七年欽定的：「普世教會為中國教會祈禱日」。讓我們特別與在中國的教友們一起祈禱，將中國教會托付於聖母的護佑和引導。正如教宗方濟各在去年的一次公開接見活動結束時所說的：「明天五月二十四日是『進教之佑』榮福童貞瑪利亞的年度瞻禮，這是中國上海佘山朝聖地特別敬禮的節日。該紀念日邀請我們在精神上與生活在中國的全體教友同在。讓我們為他們祈求聖母，好使他們能慷慨和安寧地活出信德；也使他們能做出友愛、和諧與修和的具體行動，並與伯多祿繼承人完全共融。」教宗繼續說：「在中國跟隨上主的極可愛門徒們，普世教會偕同你們並為你們祈禱，讓你們即使身處困境依然能將自己托付於天主的聖意。聖母必會助佑你們，以她的母愛守護你們。」

中國聖母，為我等祈！佘山聖母進教之佑，為我等祈！

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April showers bring May flowers. We are certainly seeing that this Spring with colorful blooms everywhere. May is a wonderful time to do some gardening, enjoy the outdoors, and go on vacation. It is also the Month of Mary.

The celebration of Mary in May was an idea mentioned in ancient Greek folktale, when May was dedicated to Artemis, the goddess of fecundity. And in ancient Rome, May was dedicated to Flora, the goddess of blooms, and celebrated with floral games. Christian culture gradually developed with these stories to honor our Blessed Mother Mary, whose beauty surpasses the sun, the moon, and all the creatures.

As society progressed to the medieval period (5th-15th century), the tradition of *Tricesimum* developed. It was also called "Thirty-Day Devotion to Mary" or "Lady Month", and observed from August 15 to September 14. It was not until the Baroque period (17th-mid-18th century) that the idea of devoting one month to Mary evolved to become the month of May. From the 19th century on, the Month of Mary is celebrated every May in most areas around the world.

So how can we honor Mary this month? Just like each one of us is unique to God, we can use our own special ways to honor Mary. Of course, certain traditions are recommended, such as reciting the Rosary and erecting a special altar for Mary. Another ceremonious practice is the May Crowning, to crown Mary's statue with elegant blossoms representing her beauty and virtue. You can honor our Blessed Mother at home with a simple statue or picture in your prayer corner, and even a spiritual crowning. No matter which method you prefer, remember to ask yourself this: Will these devotions help me strive towards our Blessed Mother's virtues, to love God and my neighbor more?

Of special mention is May 24th, the Feast of "Our Lady of Sheshan - Help of Christians". In May 2007, Pope Benedict XVI asked that this day be observed as a Day of Prayer for the Church in China. Let us specially pray for and with our brothers and sisters in Christ who live in China, that our Blessed Mother Mary will look over them and give them guidance. As Pope Francis appealed last year during the General Audience in St. Peter's Square, he said: "May 24th, it is the Feast Day of 'Mary Help of Christians', who is particularly venerated at the Sanctuary of Sheshan, in Shanghai... let us to be spiritually close to all Catholic believers who live in China and pray for them, so that they may live their faith with generosity and serenity and be able to make concrete gestures of fraternity, harmony and reconciliation in full communion with the Successor of Peter." He continued, "Dear disciples of the Lord in China, the Universal Church prays with you and for you, so that even amid difficulties, you may continue to entrust yourselves to God's will."

Our Lady of China, pray for us. Our Lady of Sheshan, pray for us!
