

Finally, we have had the leaking pipe in one of our Church restrooms repaired. One of our Alumni, Tom O'Connor HN'75, and his crew managed to fix this leak in the Fire Sprinkler System. It took us several months to locate the shut-off valve to have a better

perspective on how to solve the problem. There were days that we had to sacrifice by doing without water in the building as we tried to control the leak by shutting off some easily visible valves. Of course, there was the bigger sacrifice of the community, especially our preschoolers, as we experienced the inconvenience of the restroom with it's inventive draining structure set up. It's done, it's fixed! Now, we just have to close up the ceiling, which is just the easy part of the solution.

I believe that just like our restroom leaking pipe problem, there will be an end to this Corona Virus outbreak. This too shall pass. This will be over!

For now, we have to offer a little sacrifice. The medical experts all over the world are one in saying that the most effective way to curb and even contain the spread of the virus is for people to simply stay at home. In our small effort to help solve the problem we have already either cancelled or postponed most events and activities in the parish. In addition, and in response to Governor Newsom's announcement that people age 65 and above should isolate themselves, and President Trump's recent recommendation that all Americans avoid gathering of 10 or more people, we have suspended our Weekday masses. Most, if not all, of our weekday mass goers are more than 65 years old. FYI, Mass might even be suspended this Sunday. Archbishop's cabinet members are meeting right now. As of this writing, San Francisco Mayor London Breed is asking residents to stay home starting midnight on March 16 until April 7.

But please do not feel you are being deprived of the Sacrament of the Eucharist or the Church. I offer the following admonition:

We will not have a day go by without mass. Bishop Wang and I will be saying mass privately, offering the scheduled mass intentions and other special intentions.

During communion, it is still possible to receive the Lord through Spiritual Communion. ["An ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament (in Communion at Mass) and in lovingly embracing Him as if we had actually received Him." - St. Thomas Aguinas]

As we obey the policy of "social distancing," may we take this opportunity to be closer to God and closer to our family. Spend quality time with your family and quality time with the Lord. This is a time for "bonding with family" and most especially "bonding with the Lord." As Bishop Wang wisely says, "You don't have to go to church to make Sabbath or the Day of the Lord holy. You can make it at home."



SAINT TURIBIUS OF MOGROVEJO (1538-1606) March 23

In times of crisis, God always surprises the Church with unlikely saints, through whom Christ's light radiates



beyond their local communities to illumine the universal Church. Charles Borromeo was such a saint: appointed Archbishop of Milan at twenty-one by his papal uncle, epitomizing the corruption that the reformers condemned, Charles instead inspired a revival that reinvigorated a Church devastated by the Reformation. His less well-known contemporary, Turibius of Mongrovejo, was God's "saintly surprise" in the New World. Spanish-born lawyer, professor, head of the feared Inquisition, Turibius was still a layman when a grateful king appointed him Archbishop of far-off Lima. Once in Peru, however, Turibius was appalled at the abuse of indigenous peoples by the occupying conquistadores—his fellow countrymen—and by the complicity of the clergy. He became the natives' devoted advocate, building churches, schools, hospitals, and the first seminary in the Americas, publishing catechisms and prayerbooks in the native languages he painstakingly mastered. Four hundred years later, whenever Pope Benedict welcomed Latin American bishops to Rome, he always invoked "the shining example of San Toribio."

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT MARCH 22, 2020

I have never been able to reconcile the long faces some of us put on in Lent with the prayers of the Church that describe this as "a joyful season." The following story takes seriously that laughter is an essential element of our Lenten observance.

Once upon a time in a nice little forest, there lived an orphaned bunny and an orphaned snake. By surprising coincidence, both were blind from birth.

One day, the bunny was hopping through the forest while the snake was slithering along the same path. The bunny tripped over the snake and fell down. "Oh, my," said the bunny, "I'm terribly sorry. I didn't mean to hurt you. I've been blind since birth, so, I can't see where I'm going. In fact, I'm also an orphan, so I don't even know what I am." "It's guite okay," replied the snake, "my story is much the same as yours. I've been blind since birth and never knew my mother. Tell you what, I could slither over you, and figure out what you are."

"Oh, that would be wonderful." replied the bunny. So the snake slithered all over the bunny, and said, "Well, you're covered with soft fur; you have really long ears; your nose twitches; and you have a soft cottony tail. I'd say that you must be a bunny."

"Oh, thank you! Thank you," cried the bunny in obvious excitement. The bunny then suggested to the snake, "Maybe I could feel you with my paw, and help you in the same way you've helped me." So the bunny felt the snake all over, and remarked, "Well, you're scaly and smooth, you have a forked tongue, you're impossible to pin down and you have no backbone at all. I'd say you must be either a contractor, a consultant or possibly someone in senior management."

On reflection the Gospel of the man born blind is a joyful one too. Imagine this man's elation at having his sight restored. As the story develops the all-seeing Pharisees move to spiritual blindness by putting on the blinkers of the law. They cannot recognize Jesus or his works of mercy because of their tunnel vision. Jesus doesn't fit their worldview. Meanwhile the blind beggar, who has sight restored, goes on to gain insight about who Jesus is and the way that God works in the world; he begins to see how shallow and pathetic the Pharisees really are.

This Gospel also contains a critical theological lesson: disability and illness do not come from personal sinfulness. It's surprising that we need to keep saying this, but too readily we hear otherwise intelligent and good Christians, for example, telling us that some illnesses have been "sent" by God as punishment for sins or they wonder what their families have "done" to deserve disabled children. It's true that God permits us to live in an imperfect world where we are prone to illness and disability. But that same world gives us the freedom to be creative in the face of adversity, to be compassionate with those who are sick or disabled and free to believe that there is a purpose for each human life. God, the source of all love, does not actively send bad things to us, instead, he is our constant companion in dealing with them; giving us the courage and strength to cope with, and sometimes overcome,

The task of this joyful season is to bring our good humor and compassion to bear on the blind spots in our own lives and be on our guard for the times when we are too confident about who God is, how he works or what he can or cannot do. May it never be said of us that we were so consumed by our own religious vision that we missed God's woods for the trees.
