

Father's Column

As we were enjoying this welcome event I couldn't but think of the Sunday gospel reading. Jesus said: "Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, The kingdom of God is at hand for you." The welcome you afforded to me last Sunday was very Biblical. Ultimately, it was not I whom you have welcomed. It was Christ. By it, you let the Kingdom of God closer to you. May that event be the beginning of our journey of faith together and of our working together as we build up the body of Christ here at the Holy Name of Jesus Parish and School Community.

A Reflection on Peace and Freedom

We celebrated the Independence Day last 4th of July. And it's good to reflect on peace and freedom, two very crucial issues now a days! These two concepts are closely interconnected. We can only claim that we are at peace if we are free and vice versa. In the Bible, there are 4 levels of meanings of the word of peace and consequently of freedom.

First, peace as the absence of war. As in the Book of Kings, where during the time of Solomon, Israel was at peace. It did not have any war with its neighbors. This kind peace can only be attained if there is freedom from foreign oppressions, invasions and destructions. This is a basic meaning of peace connected with freedom from wars or oppressions. Second, peace as having good relations and mutual co- existence within one's household and with one's neighbor, as in Hebrew 12:14. This second level of meaning is about having a harmonious relationships with others that would mean freedom from hatred, anger or violence with one's family or neighbors. Third, peace - to be at peace with oneself; to accept and love oneself unconditionally, as in Luke 24:36. (The apostle were guilty and could not forgive themselves because they betrayed the Lord. The Lord offered them peace.) This peace entails freedom from guilt, from hatred of oneself, of unforgiveness of oneself. Lastly, peace as fruit of having been forgiven by Christ, of having reconciled with God, of having a loving relationship with Him. We find this in John 14: 27. Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid." And this is also the message of the Book of Psalms: *the Lord speaks of peace to his people.*

Are we truly free? As we celebrated with gratitude our nation's independence and freedom, may we deepen our desire to search for more lasting and genuine peace and freedom- that of freedom from hatred, and from sin - so that we can truly be free. Amen.
